

Brenna Bird took office as Iowa Attorney General in January 2023. Before her swearing in, she served as a county attorney for six years, first in Fremont County, then in Guthrie County, and was elected as the Iowa County Attorney Association President. Brenna was also legal counsel to Iowa Governor Terry Branstad, ran her own private practice, and taught as an adjunct professor at the University of Iowa College of Law. She lives in rural Guthrie County with her husband Bob and their son.

As attorney general, Brenna and her team uphold the rule of law and the Constitution, support law enforcement, protect Iowans from scammers, serve victims, and bring criminals to justice.

Since taking office, Brenna has:

- Launched a Cold Case Unit to help solve the more than 400 unresolved homicide and missing persons cases in Iowa
- Established the Farm and Freedom Division to defend agriculture in our state
- Sponsored a Fentanyl bill w/ Governor Reynolds to make sure dealers who kill people go to prison
- Sponsored legislation so human traffickers go to jail
- Sponsored legislation to increase penalties for assaults against law enforcement and first responders
- Conducted the first-ever audit of victim services
- Stepped up efforts to support victims of violent crimes, including doubling the pay for Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners
- And much more—and she's just getting started!

Brenna often says being the attorney general is her third job—after being wife to Bob and mom to her son. Raised on a farm, she brings the same strong work ethic and family values to her public service today.
